Webinar: Lau v. Nichols 50th Anniversary

January 22, 2024 • 6:00 pm - 8:30 pm CT

The *Lau v. Nichols* U.S. Supreme Court decision in 1974 defined the right of emergent bilingual students to equal access to a meaningful education. IDRA founder Dr. José Cárdenas testified in the case and then assisted the Office for Civil Rights in the development of the *Lau Remedies*, the first guide for schools about serving emergent bilingual students. In January 2024, we will honor the ruling's anniversary, its impact for students and what it means for today.

IDRA is co-hosting a commemorative webinar via Claremont Graduate University School of Educational Studies. Celina Moreno, J.D., IDRA President & CEO, will speak alongside the *Lau* plaintiff lawyer, school superintendents, policy experts and academics. They will discuss the policy and practice implications of the ruling through to today.

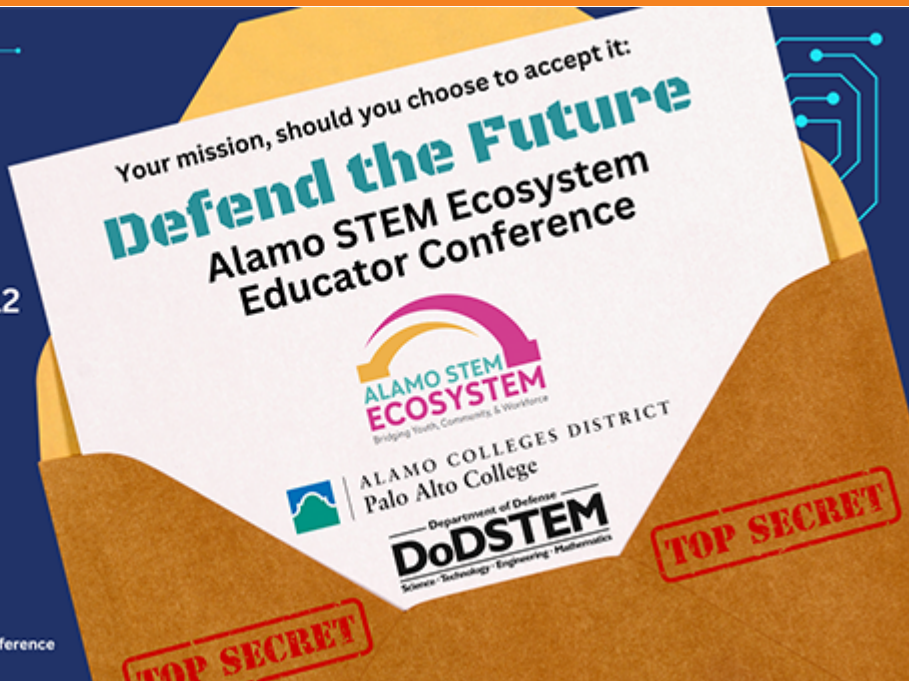

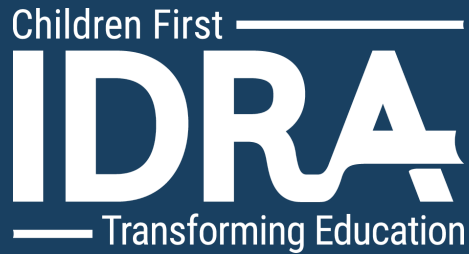
